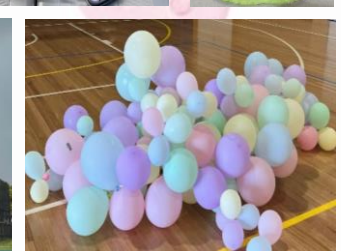
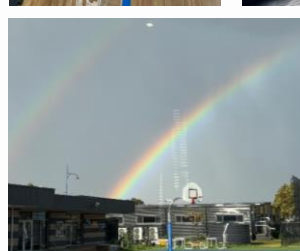
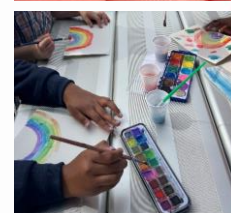


School Age Care Reflections Our Lady

At Our Lady the children have engaged in a wide variety of different activities that support the monthly themes: Movement and Activity, Nature and Outdoors, and Summer Safety.

Some of the fun and exciting things the children have been exploring at our service the past couple months are:

1. Creating DIY aeroplanes using recycled Coles bags then engaged in a flying competition.
2. The group have been exploring arts and crafts in the outdoor environment using sustainable resources.
3. Use recycled balloons from the schools DISCO in our program.
4. Creating nature inspired art.
5. Making play dough and slimy foam from scratch.

For the month of December, we have planned Christmas art and craft activities and our monthly themed activities which will be summer safety activities.

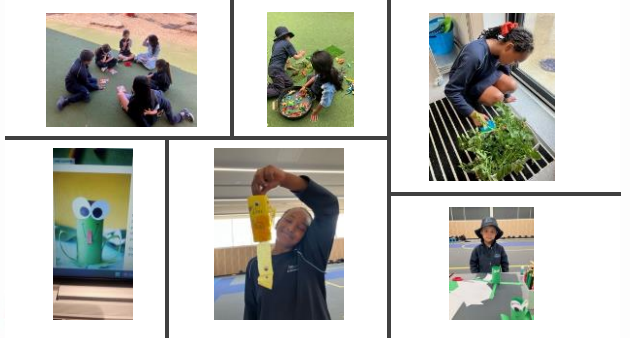


School Age Care Reflections St John

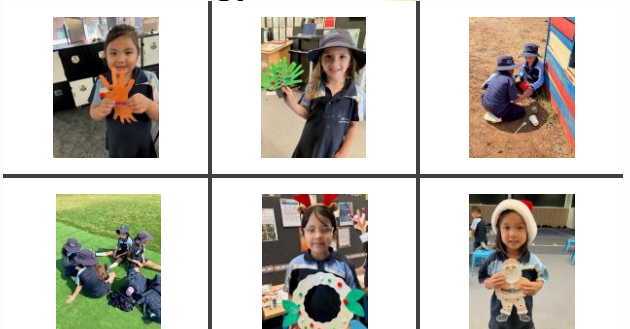
During the month of October, the children from St John did so much movement and activity. We enjoyed a lot of Just Dance, indoor running games, outdoor running games, and children had the choice of activities to put out. We played indoor basketball. Ran around on the playground, and played basketball outdoors on the courts.



November's theme was nature and outdoors, we did rock painting and collecting from outdoors, we spent a lot of time outdoors playing soccer, running around, on the oval and playground. We also made frogs out of colour paper. During this month we took our indoor toys outdoors under the green area and the children loved having the option to play under cover or on the playground area.



In the month of December, the children focused to make sure they had hats and sunscreen when going outdoors, we also took indoor toys outdoors again. During the month of December, we really focused on Christmas and fun arts and crafts to finish off a big year.





School Age Care Reflections St Martin

In October, we planned activities based on the concept of movement that enhanced cognitive processes and facilitated learning. We believed this approach emphasized integrating movement into the experiences to achieve children's engagement. Along with these experiences, many outdoor play and games which involve a lot of movement were offered to keep children active and moving during sessions. Children experimented and discovered their ways to interpret and craft their versions of creations in activities. This led to many ideas emerging which in turn helped them to develop their creativity skills. We used different types of resources available within centre which further provided them with many opportunities to engage in the activities. One of the examples of the experiences planned was a pendulum painting stem activity in which children learned problem-solving techniques along with using their imagination and understanding.



In November, we planned activities based on nature and outdoor that connected children with nature and their surroundings. We involved children in the collection of natural materials from outside and we used these materials as our resources for the planned experiences. Children showed curiosity and enthusiasm to explore textures, patterns, shapes and sizes of natural elements which were easily available in the surrounding. One memorable experience was a colour scavenger hunt, where children searched for natural items matching specific colours on a list. This activity encouraged teamwork, as children collaborated and offered clues to help their peers find the items. It was amazing to see the enthusiasm and cooperation that was observed during this experience.

Arts and crafts: Designing ornaments, creating a letterbox, and writing letters to Santa.

Decorating: Setting up the Christmas tree and crafting festive decorations.

These experiences aim to ignite the holiday spirit while fostering creativity and collaborative play.



With sunny weather, children have been enjoying extended outdoor playtime, practicing physical skills, and staying active. Group games like shark attack, memory tag, gaga ball, and soccer have been favourites, helping children enhance their physical and social interaction skills.

Indoors, board games have remained popular, with children showing enthusiasm for Spot It, Monopoly, Logos, Battleship, and Diary of a Wimpy Kid. These games encourage strategic thinking and friendly competition while providing moments of joy.

As we already know children love to be active, so it is important that we provide them with a variety of indoor and outdoor movement experiences.

We often roleplay obstacle courses and the children are now designing their own, from the equipment that we provide for them. We also celebrated "sports day", and the children had fun dressing up and playing lots of games, indoors and outdoors.



Spring was a big highlight and a conversational point amongst the children throughout our sessions this term. Now that the weather is warmer the children are wanting to be outside for longer.

We share yards and explore lots of different environments between our playgrounds. We even discovered a small nest of spiders, and our teachers helped move them to a safe place. From this discovery we made chocolate spiders. What was really exciting we had baby birds hatch in one of our kinder playgrounds. The children were so excited.

Water play and talking about being safe around water has been the topic of conversation this month.

We have been having conversations with the children about their swimming lessons and engaging with water to make their creations while playing in the sand pit. We did an experiment called "walking water", and the children just loved it.

We had a fun time celebrating R U OK? Day at Playgroup by decorating yummy yellow cookies! R U OK? Day is about checking in with the people you care about. Remember, it's okay to ask "R U OK?" any day of the year. A simple conversation could make a big difference.



Month of Planting and Playing

What a busy month it's been! Our September theme, "Nourish and Grow," has kept us busy and engaged. We've been busy little gardeners, planting seeds and learning about the elements they need to grow. The children had fun choosing their own seeds and exploring their different shapes, colours, and sizes. We also unleashed our creativity by making wild animal masks. The children loved cutting, drawing, and role-playing as their favourite jungle animals.

Playgroup Reflections

Our little learners had a wonderful time exploring our themes both indoors and outdoors. They were eager participants in all our activities, from singing songs and writing stories to imaginative play in our cozy home corner. 3 Yr. Kindergarten Reflections

Movement and Activity Theme

We began the term by introducing term 3 with the theme of Movement and Activity, with our morning warm-up exercises. We have noticed a growing interest in music and movement games, both indoors and out. The children have been initiating some of activities on their own, showcasing impressive gross motor skills, cognitive abilities, and teamwork. We also introduced children to a new song called “Stomp, Wiggle, Clap, and Tap”.



Culture and Diversity/Children Week

Celebrating Diwali, where the children enthusiastically crafted beautiful lanterns, known as Diyas. Diyas are a fundamental symbol of Diwali, representing the victory of light over darkness and the triumph of good over evil. The children also engaged in using clay to create other traditional elements, such as intricate figurines and decorations that hold special meaning during the festival. Following our Diwali festivities, we dove into Children’s Week. This special week allowed the children to express their individuality and cultural heritage. Some children came to kinder wearing vibrant outfits that reflected their cultural backgrounds, while others dressed their favourite characters from stories and movies

Remembrance Day

We recently engaged the children in a meaningful discussion about the importance of Remembrance Day, emphasizing why this occasion holds a special place in our commemorative calendar. On this day, we reflect on the sacrifices made by countless soldiers and civilians, acknowledging their bravery and the impact of their service on our lives today. Therefore, we had 1 minute of silence and then the children decorated beautiful red poppies out of red and black cellophane paper, a fun and educational group activity.



Pasting with nature

To emerge our monthly theme, Nature and Outdoor, we used natural materials in our arts and crafts activities. We provided different varieties of leaves for the children to create their beautiful pasting artwork. To enhance their creativity, we provided children with a simple image of tree branches and loved seeing the children creating their leaves on the image. Introducing natural materials allows children to experience different sensory benefits. They have different textures, sizes, colours, and smells. This Pasting activity also helps children to develop fine motor skills and foster their creativity and critical thinking abilities.
